Celebrating 25 Years of Ministry

Compassionate Outreach Ministries celebrated 25 years of lifechanging ministry last month! The ministry was founded by Bishop Larry J. Dennison on December 18th, 1985. In honor of the church's Silver Anniversary, Bishop and First Lady Dennison were presented with proclamations from both the Gainesville City Commissioners and the Alachua County Commissioners declaring Sunday, December 19th, 2010 as "Compassionate Outreach Ministries Day."

Church members and ministry friends gathered together at the Gainesville Hotel & Conference Center on December 18th for a celebratory banquet. The Honorable Gainesville City Commissioner Scherwin Henry spoke at the banquet about the consistent integrity of Bishop Dennison and also about the positive impact that Compassionate Outreach Ministries has made on the community over the last 25 years. After a scrumptious dinner, Recording Artist/Songwriter Jermia Cannon led the group in praise and worship as she sang songs that included, "Serving The Lord Will Pay Off After A While," "Ain't Nobody Mad But The Devil,"

"We're Blessed," and "His Eye Is On the Sparrow." Cannon, who is from Texarna, Texas, has recorded with the Full Gospel Holy Temple Founder's Mass Choir and has released two solo CD's: "From the Soul" and "It's My Time."

The next morning, the celebrants gathered in the sanctuary of Compassionate Outreach Ministries for a special worship service. Bishop & First Lady Dennison personally welcomed the attendees, the church's history was recounted, and the charter members were recognized. The people of God then praised God for all that He has done and is doing. During the service, the Adult Choir sang, the Praise Dancers danced and several members shared what Compassionate Outreach Ministries means to them. Also, the Honorable County Commissioner Rodney Long commented on the difference that Compassionate Outreach Ministries has made in this area of Florida and Recording Artist Cannon sang "I Won't Complain." The Word of God was shared through Prophet Anthony Moore. A Course Correction

Have you have ever felt like your life needed a course correction? If you answered "yes," what a blessing that you are able to tell when you need to make change or that change needs to be made in your life. No matter what your circumstances may be, it is a blessing to realize that your life, as it is, needs to go in a different direction. For a majority of us, I suspect, we cannot answer "yes" because most of the time we may not know it. As you go through your everyday life, things may be going well. You have a good job (or in the case of today's economy - you have A job), you are able to resolve issues at home, you feel fairly good about your spiritual walk, and things are generally going really well. However, when God is ready to use you, to bring you into the purpose of your life for Him, and to do His will, your life may make a course or



directional correction. Things will begin to happen, you may begin to feel uneasy at your job, and you may begin to question things you see around you. Then, when you go to church (Compassionate, of course) you begin to think that some of the message applies to you. In other words, you begin to feel uncomfortable – as Bishop has often told us we would. Your colleagues at work may engage you in discord, your marriage or family relationships may begin to be stressed or stretched, and you may

even wonder, "Why is the enemy bothering me?" Welcome to the beginning of the time of your purpose! God will sometimes allow discomfort in your life. God wants to take us to closer, different, and higher places in Him, and the only way to get our attention is to cause us to think about and depend more on Him. When we think about Him, we talk to Him, we cry out to Him, we beseech Him, we invoke Him, we praise Him, we worship Him, we allow Him to guide our path (or order our steps - as the song states), we yield to Him, we seek Him until we find a new place of comfort and peace in Him. But don't get comfortable, because He is not through with us yet! This is just the beginning of your course correction. Just grab onto God and he will steady you through this phase of your course correction.

It is a blessing to realize that your life, as it is, needs to go in a different direction.

A New Year Health Tip

From The C.O.M. Health Team



One of the best ways to guarantee goal-setting success is to ensure that each of your goals or New Year's resolutions fits the SMART formula. SMART is an acronym that stands for Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic and Timely. When your goals have these characteristics, you are more likely to achieve them. Setting short-term, medium-term, and long-term goals for yourself is a key to success in your life. If there are things that you want to achieve or ways that you want to grow, setting clear goals as stepping stones is an important strategy to attain the success you want. A goal should provide guidance and direction. Goals like 'lose weight,' 'eat better,' or 'have less stress' are far too vague and unspecific to help you achieve the changes you want. Use the S.M.A.R.T. criteria to help put more detail into your goal. Below is an example of a SMART goal to eat at least 5 servings of fruit and vegetables a day.

Specific: Eat | piece of fruit at breakfast, | piece of fruit at 4:00 pm, 2 servings of vegetables at lunch, and 2 servings at supper. Measurable: Record how many veggies and fruit I eat each day & Use a measuring cup to make sure I eat I cup of vegetables. Achievable: I am going to start by eating 2 pieces of fruit a day.

Rewarding : When I eat 2 pieces of fruit a day, I will feel like I have really done something to improve my health.

Time Frame: This week I am going to eat more fruit. Next week I am going to eat more fruit and eat more vegetables.

Spending a little time up front to create effective goals with the SMART characteristics will pay off in the long run. (Adapted from CHOICES)
