The C.O.M. Singles are expecting great things in this new season! Many thanks to Bishop & First Lady Dennison for hosting the Conference and to the married couples who served.














The Power of the Spoken Word

Over the last several weeks we've heard a great deal of teaching on the tongue which refers to "our spoken words." All of us probably grew up believing the children's rhyme, "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words

can never hurt me." Yet, at a certain point in our lives, we realized that this was completely untrue and that words can and do hurt. Every negative word that we use is potentially a deadly weapon. It has the power to slowly chip away at dreams and ambitions, our energy and our health. It is almost like a form of self-hypnosis whereby negative words begin to program our negative behavior for the future.

But, what if I told you that we also have the power to alter circumstances in a positive way by the words that we speak? I realize that this sounds a bit farfetched and I can only imagine what some of you are thinking? But the truth is that our words really do have extraordinary power; in fact, the Bible teaches us that life and death are in the power of the tongue (Prov. 18:21), meaning that our very words can either prosper us or harm us. So when we say things that are the opposite of what we desire (i.e. complaining), we are essentially affecting the quality of our lives. Contrary to what some believe, words are not simply sounds caused by air passing through our vocal cords. They actually have real power to effect change. The Word of the Lord teaches us that our Words are seeds (Luke 8:11). In fact, whatever is in a seed must produce after its own kind. For example, an apple seed will produce apples. This principle is especially true where words are concerned. A situation can worsen when we speak negatively about it. By the same token, when we speak positive words, our circumstances can change for the better. In the book of James, the writer compares our words to the rudder of a ship. James points out that once words are spoken they begin to steer circumstances in a specific direction. James teaches us that our words have the ability to

set the entire course of one's life on fire, further revealing its supernatural power.

If you still have doubts about how powerful words are, think about this for a moment: God created the heavens and the earth by speaking them into existence. In Genesis 1 you will see that God said "Let there be light", "Let there be a firmament", "Let the waters be divided", "Let the earth bring forth grass" and so on. Every one of these cases represents a problem followed by a spoken solution. This is a concept taught in the Bible where God describes as "calling those things that be not as though they were" (Rom 4:17). The concept of calling for what is not seen is exactly what God did in Genesis 1. God saw there was no light and said there was light and then the light came. You can see this principle demonstrated throughout the following verses: Genesis 1:3, 1:6, 1:9, 1:11, 1:14, 1:20 and 1:24. It is a very powerful lesson from God left on record for us. God plainly provides us an example of how we should operate in the world today.

Now, let's look at Genesis 1:26, Here, God said "Let us make man in our image and after our likeness and let them have dominion...." So if God said this, did this happen like the other 7 times God said? You can clearly see that everything God said in Genesis 1 came to pass exactly like he declared it, so these words spoken about us are no different. If we are designed by God to be like God, then we would have to be open to operate like God does. I realize that I have lost many of you, but let me remind you that Jesus said in Mark 9:23 "...all things are possible to him who believes." I have to point out though that our petitions must be in accordance with God's will, and not our own.

So the question we need to ask ourselves is, "What are we creating with our words?" Are our words filled with hate or love, bitterness or blessing, complaining or compliments, defeat or victory? Jesus said in Matthew 12:36 that, "... men will have to give account for every idle word they speak." I personally believe that God will also hold us accountable for the things that we were supposed to accomplish while here and failed to do because of our unbelief or fear. This is the season to dig deep so that the power of God's Word can be revealed in your life.
